For your summer vacation art homework, let's explore abstract art through the works of Pablo Picasso and the paintings of Claude Monet. Both artists have made significant contributions to the world of art, and their styles are distinct and influential in their respective movements.

1. Pablo Picasso:

Haystacks series (1890s):

In this series, Monet painted haystacks in various lighting conditions, emphasizing the changing effects of light and atmosphere on the same subject. These paintings demonstrate his exploration of color, light, and texture, creating almost abstract compositions while still representing recognizable forms.

Both Picasso and Monet contributed to the development of abstract art, albeit in different ways. While Picasso focused on deconstructing and rearranging forms to explore multiple perspectives, Monet sought to capture the transient

qualities of light and atmosphere through his loose brushwork and emphasis on colour.
